

On June 5, 2018, at approximately 1228 hours, I (Officer Nathan Haig L80/1112) responded to the intersection of W. 9th Street and Indiana Street in reference to an injury crash involving a motor vehicle and a pedestrian. Upon my arrival, I contacted Officer L. Corder. Officer L. Corder requested I speak to the driver of the motor vehicle.

Standing on the sidewalk near the crash, I contacted the driver, Kendall Kohnle, of Unit 1, a white Honda CRV bearing KS 253JRZ. Kohnle advised she was not injured and did not need medical attention. Kohnle advised she was driving Unit 1 southbound in the 800 block of Indiana Street. Kohnle approached the intersection of W. 9th Street and Indiana Street. Kohnle advised she came to a complete stop at the stop sign. Kohnle advised she waited approximately twenty seconds for the intersection to be clear of traffic. Kohnle did not see any vehicles approaching the intersection, so she drove Unit 1 south across the intersection. Kohnle stated she traveled across the intersection and was on the south portion of the intersection when she heard a loud noise. Kohnle did not know what the noise was from, but due to the loud noise she believed the noise was from a person. Kohnle stated she immediately parked her vehicle, exited the vehicle, and observed the subject lying down. Kohnle advised she never saw the subject riding his bicycle prior to the crash. Kohnle remained on scene until officers arrived.

I assisted Officer Corder in investigating the scene. After conducting the investigation, I removed the bicycle from the scene and entered the bicycle into evidence as personal property.
