Panelist—**Hannes Zacharias, Professor of Practice, KU School of Public and Admin.**

Hannes Zacharias' career in public service began in 1980 when he served as Associate Director and Chief Grants Officer for the Kansas Arts Commission before becoming Assistant to the City Manager for the City of Lawrence in 1984. He was named the City Administrator for Boonville, Missouri, in 1988, and moved to Hays, Kansas in 1992 to serve as City Manager for nine years. He joined the Johnson County's management team in 2001 as Assistant County Manager and was promoted to Deputy County Manager in January 2005. He later became County Manager and served in that position for 9 years.



Panelist—**Dr. Donald Kettl, Professor and Academic Director, Univ. of Texas LBJ School of Public Affairs**

Dr. Don Kettl has authored or edited numerous books, including *Can Governments Earn Our Trust?* (2017); *Little Bites of Big Data for Public Policy* (2017); and *The Politics of the Administrative Process* (7th edition, 2017). He has received three lifetime achievement awards and twice won the Louis Brownlow Book Award of the National Academy of Public Administration. Before a transition to UT's LBJ School of Public Affairs, Dr. Kettl was professor and dean in the School of Public Policy at the University of Maryland. Dr. Kettl has consulted for government organizations at all levels, including most recently the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs.



Panelist—**Bernie Hayen, Director of Finance Manhattan, Kansas and Instructor for KSU's College of Business Admin.**

Bernie Hayen's areas of interest include business, government, and society. He holds an MBA from Wichita State University, and an MPA from Kansas State University. He is currently the Director of Finance for Manhattan, KS while also instructing courses related to business ethics at KSU. His research includes the Usefulness of Codes of Ethics in Government, Civility and Tolerance in American Cities, and Measuring the Level of Ethical Conduct in the Workplace. He is published in the *Kansas Government Journal*, *Southern Cities Journal*, *Nation's Cities Weekly*, and the *International City Manager's Association Research Publications*.

Toby Dougherty was appointed to the position of Hays City Manager on August 1, 2007. Toby previously served as Assistant City Manager since March of 2005.
