
Why Student Voters Matter: Historically young adults have voted at lower rates than older cohorts. They are also the newest members of our democracy, move more frequently, are less likely to have a driver's license, and may be less likely to be contacted directly by political campaigns, all of which are barriers to registering to vote. Students have a decision about where to register to vote, where they live at families home, or where they live to attend school. You may only be registered and vote at one location.
